Under North Carolina law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. Chapter 99E of the North Carolina General Statutes."

- I acknowledge that there are inherent dangers and risks in horseback riding and in being around or working with horses. I realize that I/my child could be injured, maimed or killed while engaging in horseback riding or while being around or working with horses. I am prepared to take these risks.
- I agree to indemnify JAKE'S FLAT FARM AND STABLES,LLC, John Jaynes and Elisabeth Bliss-Jaynes from any and all claims, demands, suits, or liability which may be brought against them by others as a result of injuries sustained by myself/child while riding on their premises, while riding a horse supplied by them, or simply while being around or working with a horse on their premises.
- I acknowledge it is the rider's responsibility to wear protective headgear while mounted. It has been recommended to me that the protective headgear meet the A.S.T.M. (American Society for Testing Materials) standard and display the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal.
- Jake's Flat Farm and Stables,LLC, its employees and/or representatives make no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury and death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injury.
- I acknowledge that it is the rider's responsibility to wear appropriate footwear while on the premises of JAKE'S FLAT FARM AND STABLES,LLC. I will wear this footwear whether mounted or on the ground. This footwear will include shoes/boots and socks. Shoes or boots will have a flat tread sole, a 1" heel, and a fully enclosed upper. Boots or shoes designed for the purpose of equestrian activity are preferred but not required.
- I acknowledge that it is the rider's responsibility to wear appropriate clothing which will include but not be limited to full length pants and minimal jewelry. I understand that JAKES FLAT FARM AND STABLES, LLC accepts no liability for injury or damage to clothing/jewelry or injury caused by clothing/injury and reserves the right to request that I change clothing/jewelry that is deemed unsafe.

- Horse camp will operate during the hours listed. . Due to our inability to provide supervision for children outside of the camp day, children are expected to arrive no earlier than 30 minutes prior to the start of the day and to be picked up no later than 30 minutes past the end of the day. Children arriving early or remaining late will be charged at the rate of \$5/30 minutes to reimburse the baby sitter required for supervision during this time.
- Horsecamp is an outside activity. Children will be exposed to sun, insects, pollen, and lots of dirt. We make sunscreen, bug spray, and soap available to campers and encourage children to bring any specialized products needed for hygiene or protection from sun and pests.
- Please realize that children will get dirty, and clothing, shoes/belongings are at risk for damage in the course of the day. We encourage campers to wear comfortable durable shoes and clothing. Although we do not require specific clothing or footwear, if children wear open toed shoes, they will not be allowed to interact with horses until they are wearing full cover shoes. Girls are discouraged from wearing dresses or very short shorts due because these garments do not provide enough protection to their legs when mounted. We cannot be responsible for jewelry, valuables, accessories, or electronics.
- If your child requires medication or must carry specialized medical products such as epi-pens please inform camp personnel so that we can address these items and insure the appropriate care for your child.
- We provide bottled water and a cooler of ice for children to keep their lunch and drinks cool. We encourage children to bring a lunch suitable for the cooler and at least one snack such as an apple, carrots, or crackers. Children are welcome to bring extra drinks or juice.
- If a child wishes to bring treats for their horse or pony, the only acceptable treats are carrots. Treats are fed only under direct supervision of camp staff using a pony bowl. So please let us know if you are including a horse treat in your child's food. Please do not send sugar, mints, or processed treats for the horses.
